IMPORTANT:



- <u>4-H Camp Registration</u>: 4-H Summer Day Camp registration is on a first come, first served basis. Your child(ren) MUST enroll/re-enroll in 4Honline each year to be considered registered in 4-H Summer Day Camps. Enroll online at <u>https://v2.4honline.com/ (See Instructions in brochure).</u> Once you have enrolled each child in 4Honline, your child will be able to participate in the 4-H summer day camps. It is your responsibility to make sure the day camp registration form is correct. Your child is considered registered once fees and form are received. Fees are paid in person at the 4-H office. Mail in registrations will NOT be accepted. Camp fees are NON-REFUNDABLE. There is <u>NO</u> waiting list. Space is limited!!!
- Age Requirement: 4-H age is for youth 5 18 years old. Youth must meet the age requirement (age is determined by age as of January 1, 2024) for each camp. Please remember to only sign your child up for camps where they meet the age requirement. If your child attends a camp and does not meet the age requirement, you will be called to come pick up your child. Make sure you look over the registration form for accuracy. If you sign your child up for the wrong age group, your fees are NON-REFUNDABLE.
- <u>Camp Attire</u>: Participants <u>must</u> wear closed toe shoes for all 4-H Summer Day camps. Flip flops, and sandals are not allowed. Shirts and tops should cover your midriff when sitting or standing. Shorts, dresses, and skirts must be fingertip length.
- <u>Location</u>: All 4-H Summer Day Camps will be held at the Wayne County Cooperative Extension office at the Maxwell Regional Agricultural Convention Center located at 3114 Wayne Memorial Drive. We are in Suite B. Some camps are field trips; therefore, we will be traveling from the office by van. All field trips will be specified in the day camp description.
- Drop Off/Pick Up: You may drop off your child <u>no more than</u> 10 minutes before each camp. All campers must be picked up at the designated end time for the camp.
- <u>Personal Items</u>: Wayne County Cooperative Extension (4-H) are not responsible for any damage, lost or stolen items while at Wayne County 4-H Summer Day Camps. We suggest that your child leave all valuables at home.
- <u>Bag Lunch/Snack:</u> Please remember to bring a bag lunch for desginated camps. You are responsible for providing a snack for your child during camp. <u>Snacks will not</u> be provided.
- Field Trips: Field trips are for participants ONLY. Parents and other adults are <u>NOT</u> permitted.

Enrolling in 4HOnline

<u>Re-enrollment</u>

Note: All youth must be enrolled in 4-Honline each year

If you have previously enrolled, use the same email to login and update your child's information.

SETTING UP A PROFILE

You will be required to set up a family profile on 4HOnline, N.C. 4-H Enrollment and event registration program. The family profile will be where the members (Youth) will be enrolled. The website can be found at: https://v2.4honline.com/

1 Go to <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u> Click "Don't have an account?" If you have <u>never</u> enrolled in 4-H before using 4Honline.

<u>NOTE:</u> Your family profile must be associated with a valid email address. This will be your login and you will receive communications to this address. It will also be the email address where a password reset will be sent, if needed. The email you provide can only be associated with one family profile. If 4Honline does not accept your email address, you may already have a 4Honline family account. Contact our office for assistance.

2 Select North Carolina from the drop down menu. Select "N.C. 4-H and Youth Development" for the Institution.

3 Select your county "*Wayne*" from the drop down menu. NOTE: When selecting your county, you are choosing the 4-H program in which your family will participate. Click "**Continue**".



4 Complete your family's information. Required fields are marked in **red** and must be completed to move to the next screen. If you have mistakenly chosen the wrong county, just hit the back button to adjust it before moving on to the next screen. Click the "**Create Account**" button

<u>NOTE</u>: An email account can only be associated with one family profile. If you enter an email address that is already associated with a 4HOnline profile, you will see an existing family profile message. Click the "Confirm" button and continue to log in to the existing account. See instructions for logging into an existing family account.

5 Enter your family's address information and click "Verify". The verification process may require you to select an appropriate USPS format. After the address is verified, your family profile has been created! You will receive an email confirming your family profile. The next screen will allow you to add the first member to your family.

6 After adding the family, add your children you wish to enroll in the 4-H Summer Day Camp to that family profile. Use **Youth** as type of membership. When **adding a club**, select the **4-H Summer Day Camp** from the drop down and click "*Add Club*" button to save the selected club. Each youth must have a club marked in order to be enrolled. Repeat the same steps to choose your project. Select **4-H New Member Guide** as the project of your interest.

7 The next pages are authorization releases and health forms for risk management. These are important to have completed in case of an injury at the 4-H Summer Day Camp program. If you have questions or concerns, contact our office at 919-731-1527.


