Hands: Gaining new skills, mastering skills already known, developing respect for work and pride in accomplishments, and learning to live and work with others.

Health: Practicing healthful living, protecting the well being of self and others, and making constructive use of leisure time.

INSTRUCTIONS 4-H CLUB ENROLLMENT MUST BE SUBMITTED ONLINE IN ORDER FOR YOUR CHILD TO BE ENROLLED IN A CLUB!!!

SETTING UP A PROFILE

You will be required to set up a family profile on 4HOnline, the one-line N.C. 4-H Enrollment and event registration program. The family profile will be where the members (Youth) will be enrolled. The website can be found at https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in

1 To Create a family profile, select I need to setup a profile, complete the fields and click create login.

What happens if it says User account already exist? This means a family profile exists with that email address because your child was already enrolled through their local Extension Office. Select "I forgot my password" and a new password will be emailed to the email address on file. Please do not create a 2nd account! Then follow the steps on the tip-sheet, Re-Enrolling in 4hOnline.

2 Follow the instructions on the Family information page and click Continue. SET UP ONLY ONE (1) FAMILY PROFILE PER HOUSEHOLD!

After adding the family, add your children you wish to enroll in the 4-H program to that family profile. Use **Youth** as type of membership. The next pages are authorization releases and health forms for risk management. These are important to have completed in case of an injury at the 4-H program. If you have questions or concerns filling out the forms, contact our office.

When adding a club, select the 4-H club you are participating in from the drop down and click "Add Club" button to save the selected club. Each youth must have a club marked in order to be enrolled. Repeat the same steps to choose your project. The project to select is a project of your interest.

When you complete the registration process – click

"Submit Enrollment" to send your child's

4-H Enrollment to the 4-H office for activation and enrollment.
